

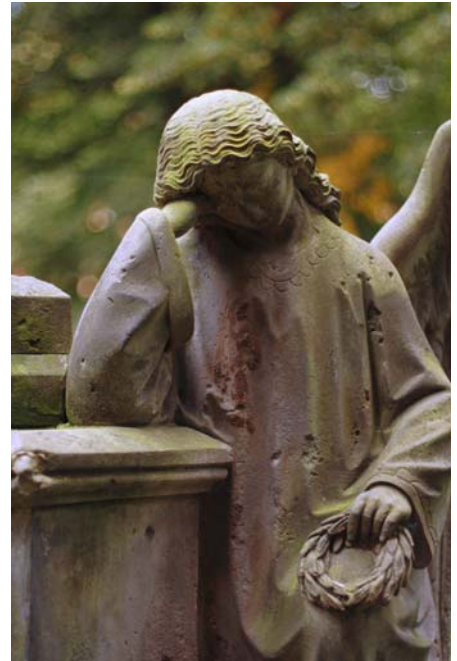

The Remnants of Once Fine Girls tells the story of Sarah, a mid-wife with Medicines sans Frontiers in Darfur. A tragic death brings her home and disturbs her sense of who she really is. Can she reconstruct her life from the remnants her twin sister left behind?



Director, Harry Durnall said "I was very excited to acquire the rights to produce this thought provoking play for the very first time... the story has many twists and turns, the dialogue is tight and engaging....and the character's journey is guaranteed to keep an audience fully engaged."

Stephen Todd's radio play, *Proud Songster*, was a winner of Channel 4's 'The Radio Plays the Thing' competition, and his works have been produced at several venues in London and throughout the UK.

The cast of seven women include in the principle roles, Sarah Gates as the twin sisters, Hannah and Sarah, Julie McNicholls as their elder sister, Kate, and Barbara Hogger as Martha Leimbach.
